Judicial Proceedings

Vehicle Law - Abandoned Vehicles - Disposition

This departmental bill allows an abandoned vehicle of any age to be transferred to an automotive dismantler and recycler or scrap processor without a certificate of title after a process to notify the last known owner or after a notice by publication. Further, an automotive dismantler and recycler or scrap processor must require a person who transfers such a vehicle to execute an indemnity agreement.

Fiscal Summary

State Effect: None. The bill codifies the existing practice of the Motor Vehicle Administration (MVA).

Local Effect: None.

Small Business Effect: The Department of Transportation has determined that this bill has minimal or no impact on small business (attached). Legislative Services concurs with this assessment.

Analysis

Current Law: If a vehicle is more than eight years old and has no engine or otherwise is totally inoperable, the law does not require a pre-disposition notification process. Also, current law authorizes, but does not require, a person to obtain an indemnity agreement before transfer to an automotive dismantler and recycler or scrap processor.

Background: On October 15, 1998, a U.S. District Court judge found in the case of

Associated Commercial Corporation vs. Rodney O. Wood, et al. that it was unconstitutional to allow a transfer of title of an abandoned vehicle without a prior notification to the owner. As a result, the Attorney General's office advised the MVA to treat all abandoned vehicle transfers as they would transfers of abandoned vehicles that are less than eight years old.
