Environmental Matters

State Board of Physicians - Powers and Duties

This bill repeals the requirement that the Board of Physician Quality Assurance must receive a written and signed complaint before investigating an alleged violation of law relating to licensure and regulation of physicians.

Fiscal Summary

State Effect: In FY 1999, the board investigated 2,132 complaints and expects to investigate ten additional complaints as a result of the bill's repeal of the written complaint requirements. Any increase in investigations could be handled with existing resources.

Current Law: The board must receive a signed, written complaint before conducting an investigation.
