# **FISCAL NOTE**

House Bill 493 (Delegate Sher) Environmental Matters

#### **Electricity - Certificate of Public Convenience and Necessity**

This bill modifies provisions relating to certificates of public convenience and necessity (CPCNs), including altering the definitions of "electric company" and "construction."

#### **Fiscal Summary**

**State Effect:** The bill is not expected to significantly impact governmental operations or finances.

**Local Effect:** Efficiency savings for local government entities that would make modifications to existing generating stations and build on-site generating stations without obtaining a CPCN.

Small Business Effect: Potential meaningful.

#### Analysis

**Bill Summary:** The bill would:

- allow a person who does not qualify as an electric company to construct an on-site generating station without obtaining a CPCN;
- eliminate the need for a CPCN for the expansion, modification, or renovation of an existing generating station; and
- eliminate the requirement that the Public Service Commission (PSC) find that capacity is necessary to ensure a sufficient supply of electricity to customers in the State in order to exercise a right of condemnation in connection with the construction of a generating station.

**Current Law:** On-site generating projects and modifications to existing generating stations are not exempt from the requirement that a CPCN be obtained from the PSC.

Unless a CPCN for the construction is first obtained from the PSC, and the PSC has found that the capacity is necessary to ensure a sufficient supply of electricity to customers in the State, a person may not exercise a right of condemnation in connection with the construction of a generating station.

**State Fiscal Effect:** The bill is not expected to significantly impact the workload or finances of the PSC.

**Local Fiscal Effect:** The bill would provide efficiency savings to local government entities that would make modifications to existing generating stations and build on-site generating stations without obtaining a CPCN. Currently, approximately six municipalities in the State act as electric suppliers.

**Small Business Effect:** Small businesses could modify existing generating stations and build on-site generating stations without first obtaining a CPCN.
