House Bill 783 (Delegates Nathan-Pulliam and Morhaim) Environmental Matters

### **Prescription Drugs - Required Labeling**

This bill requires a pharmacist to indicate on a prescription label whether the drug or product is a generic equivalent of the prescribed drug or product.

## **Fiscal Summary**

**State Effect:** None. The bill's requirement does not materially affect governmental finances or operations.

Local Effect: None.

**Small Business Effect:** Minimal. Pharmacists that are small businesses would be required to place additional information on drug labels, which may require some additional computer programming or printing costs.

## **Analysis**

**Current Law:** Pharmacists are required to provide generic substitution information to a patient in writing. The information does not have to be placed on the label of the drug or product.
