Environmental Matters

Individuals in Mental Health Facilities with Developmental Disabilities

This bill requires the Department of Health and Mental Hygiene (DHMH) to study and prepare a written report that protects the confidentiality of "qualified individuals" and addresses the following issues: (1) the discharge status of each qualified individual who resides in a State facility as of July 1, 2000, including length of stay, diagnosis, barriers to release, and efforts to discharge; (2) the frequency and length of use of physical restraint on qualified individuals residing in State facilities during the period from July 1, 1999, through December 31, 1999; and (3) alternative methods and locations for serving qualified individuals. The bill defines a qualified individual as an individual with a disability qualifying for services from the Developmental Disabilities Administration and defines a State facility as a DHMH-owned or operated facility. DHMH must submit the written report to the General Assembly by December 1, 2000.

The bill's effective date is July 1, 2000.
