### Vehicle Laws - Duty to Yield Right-of-Way to Buses and School Vehicles

The bill requires the driver of a motor vehicle to yield the right-of-way to a bus or school vehicle if the driver of the bus or school vehicle signals an intention to change lanes or merge into traffic from a stopped, standing, or parked position.

## **Fiscal Summary**

**State Effect:** Minimal general fund revenue increase from the penalty provision applicable to this offense under the Maryland Vehicle Law (maximum \$500 fine). Enforcement could be handled with existing resources.

Local Effect: None.

**Small Business Effect:** None.

### **Analysis**

**Current Law:** There are no provisions requiring a vehicle to yield the right-of-way to bus or school bus.
