Virginia-Maryland-District of Columbia Joint Legislative Commission on Interstate Transportation

This joint resolution establishes a 25-member Virginia-Maryland-District of Columbia Joint Legislative Commission on Interstate Transportation. The commission is required to develop recommendations concerning improved transportation links in the Metropolitan Washington Region. The resolution allows the commission to appoint a Citizens Advisory Committee. The commission is prohibited from duplicating the work and effort of public bodies. The commission is required to report its findings and recommendations to the Governor and the Maryland General Assembly in time to submit its findings and recommendations to the respective General Assemblies, as well as the Mayor and Council of the District of Columbia, at the 2001 legislative sessions.
