Senate Bill 614 (Senators Jimeno and Hughes)

Judicial Proceedings

Commission on Juvenile Justice Jurisdiction - Extension of Sunset

This bill extends the termination date for the Commission on Juvenile Justice Jurisdiction from September 30, 2000, to September 30, 2001. The commission must submit a supplemental report updating the results of its investigation and study, together with any resulting policy recommendations, to the Governor and the General Assembly by September 30, 2001.

The bill takes effect July 1, 2000.

Fiscal Summary

State Effect: An extension of the Commission on Juvenile Justice Jurisdiction could be handled by the Department of Juvenile Justice using existing budgeted resources.

Local Effect: None.

Small Business Effect: None.

Analysis

Current Law: The Commission on Juvenile Justice Jurisdiction is a 23-member commission formed in 1998 to study matters relating to juvenile court jurisdiction. The commission must submit a report to the Governor and the General Assembly by September 30, 2000, at which time it is scheduled to terminate. The commission is staffed by the Department of Juvenile Justice.
