Senate Bill 195 (Senator Bromwell. *et al.*)

Budget and Taxation

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World War II Memorial Fund

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This bill requires the Governor to appropriate \$250,000 in the fiscal 2001 State budget to the Department of Veterans Affairs. The department must donate the funds to the World War II Memorial Fund. The memorial will be located in Washington, DC.

The bill is effective July 1, 2000.

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Fiscal Summary

**State Effect:** The FY 2001 State budget includes a general fund appropriation of \$250,000 to the World War II Memorial Fund. Additional appropriations would not be required in future years.

**Local Effect:** None.

**Small Business Effect:** None.

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Analysis

**Current Law:** No State funds have been appropriated for the World War II Memorial Fund.

**Background:** Currently, there is not a national memorial dedicated to the United States citizens, including 250,000 residents of Maryland, who served in the armed forces and Merchant Marine during World War II. The World War II Memorial Fund was established by Public Law 103-32 in 1993 to raise money nationally for the construction of a World War II memorial located in Washington, DC. The American Battle Monuments Commission, an

independent federal agency created in 1923, was charged with designing the memorial and encouraging private donations for the construction of the memorial. The fund-raising campaign has raised more than \$70 million of the \$100 million needed to design, build, and maintain the memorial. Support has come primarily from private funds but 26 states, including Pennsylvania, New Jersey, and West Virginia, have also supported the effort.
