Task Force to Study the Redevelopment and Revitalization of U.S. Highway 1

This bill establishes a 21-member task force to study the redevelopment and revitalization of U.S. Highway 1 from the intersection of U.S. Highway 1 and Interstate Highway 495 in Prince George's County to the intersection of U.S. Highway 1 and Interstate Highway 695 in Baltimore County. The task force must: (1) study commercial redevelopment and revitalization of the area adjacent to U.S. Highway 1; (2) study roadway and transportation improvements necessary to promote redevelopment; (3) consult with local designated revitalization committees; (4) recommend strategies for economic development and revitalization of areas adjacent to U.S. Highway 1; (5) recommend design changes to U.S. Highway 1; and (6) recommend funding priories to the Governor to facilitate redevelopment.

The Maryland Department of Transportation (MDOT) must coordinate with other State agencies to provide staffing for the task force. The task force must issue a preliminary report of its findings and recommendations to the Governor and the General Assembly by December 31, 2000. A final report must be issued by February 1, 2001. The bill is effective July 1, 2000.

Fiscal Summary

State Effect: Any expense reimbursements for task force members and staffing costs for MDOT and other agencies are assumed to be minimal and absorbable within existing resources.
