#### **FISCAL NOTE**

House Bill 87 Judiciary (Delegate Grosfeld)

### Family Law - Alimony - Grounds for Divorce

This bill provides that, when alimony is available, a court may award alimony to either party, regardless of whether the party seeking alimony alleges or proves the existence of a ground that would entitle that party to a limited or absolute divorce.

The bill applies only to cases filed on or after the bill's October 1, 2000, effective date.

## **Fiscal Summary**

**State Effect:** None.

**Local Effect:** The bill would not materially affect circuit court operations.

**Small Business Effect:** None.

## **Analysis**

**Current Law:** The statute that the bill seeks to amend currently states simply that the court may award alimony to either party. A court may award alimony on a bill of complaint for alimony or as part of a decree that grants an annulment, a limited divorce, or an absolute divorce.

#### Additional Information

**Prior Introductions:** A similar bill was introduced during the 1999 session as HB 247 and received an unfavorable report from the Judiciary Committee.
