Judiciary

Criminal Procedure - Sentencing - Costs of Confinement

This bill provides that when a judge sentences a defendant to a term of confinement in a State correctional facility, the judge shall also declare in open court the total cost, including overhead, of confining the defendant for the full term. The failure of a judge to comply with this requirement does not affect the legality of the sentence.
