House Bill 1387 (Howard County Delegation) Environmental Matters

Howard County - Sales of Tobacco Products Ho. Co. 14-00

This bill authorizes Howard County to regulate, by ordinance, the sale of cigarettes or other tobacco products. Howard County is authorized to require a person to obtain a county license or permit notwithstanding the possession of a license from the State. The bill authorizes Howard County to suspend or revoke a county license or permit, establish civil and criminal penalties, and establish procedures or requirements to implement the provisions of the bill.

Fiscal Summary

State Effect: None. Tobacco tax revenues would not be directly affected.

Local Effect: According to Howard County, revenues generated from licenses and permits would offset any increase in administrative/enforcement expenditures.

Small Business Effect: Minimal.
