House Joint Resolution 27 (Delegate Kopp)

Appropriations

Secondary Career and Technology Education Programs

This joint resolution states that it is the intent of the General Assembly to concur with the decision to include secondary career and technology education programs in the Maryland Unified Plan for Workforce Investment.

Fiscal Summary

State Effect: Compliance with this joint resolution would not directly affect State finances.

Local Effect: None.

Small Business Effect: None.

Analysis

Current Law: Section 501(b)(1) of the federal Workforce Investment Act of 1998 specifically permits and encourages the submission of unified state plans to ensure coordination of, and to avoid duplication between, workforce development activities.

Background: The Governor's Work Force Investment Board is coordinating the effort to develop the Maryland Unified Plan for Workforce Investment. The plan will discuss each workforce development program in the State and will articulate the vision, mission, goals, and objectives of the State's workforce investment system. A draft of the plan is

currently available and a final version is expected by April 1, 2000. The draft plan includes discussion of the State's secondary career and technology education programs.
