Community Associations - Civil Liability

This bill adds community associations as a type of organization to which the Maryland Associations, Organizations, and Agents Act applies. An agent is not personally liable for damages in a lawsuit if the association maintains liability insurance with specified minimum levels of coverage, except in cases of malice or gross negligence. The association is only liable to the extent of the insurance coverage limits.

This bill takes effect June 1, 2000.

Fiscal Summary

State Effect: The bill would not directly affect governmental operations or finances.

Local Effect: The bill would not directly affect governmental operations or finances.

Small Business Effect: Potential minimal. The bill limits the liability of community associations.

Analysis

Current Law: The Maryland Associations, Organizations, and Agents Act currently applies to athletic clubs, charitable organizations, civic leagues, cooperative housing corporations, councils of condominium unit owners, and homeowners associations.

Prior Introductions: This bill was introduced in the 1999 session as HB 913 and received an unfavorable report from the Judiciary Committee.
