# AMENDMENTS TO SENATE BILL NO. 441 (First Reading File Bill)

### AMENDMENT NO. 1

On page 1, in line 2, strike "Liquor" and substitute "<u>Powers of</u>"; strike beginning with "providing" in line 3 down through "inspectors" in line 8 and substitute "<u>authorizing inspectors in</u> <u>Harford County who investigate violations of alcoholic beverages licenses to issue civil citations</u> under certain circumstances; and generally relating to the powers of alcoholic beverages inspectors";

in line 11, strike "15-112(n)" and substitute "<u>16-408</u>";

after line 13, insert:

"By repealing and reenacting, with amendments, <u>Article 27 - Crimes and Punishments</u> <u>Section 402(d)</u> <u>Annotated Code of Maryland</u> (1996 Replacement Volume and 2000 Supplement)".

## AMENDMENT NO. 2

On pages 1 and 2, strike in their entirety the lines beginning with line 17 on page 1 through line 2 on page 2, inclusive, and substitute:

## "<u>16-408.</u>

The inspectors in Anne Arundel County, HARFORD COUNTY, Montgomery County, and Prince George's County who investigate license violations under this article may issue civil citations as provided in Article 27, § 402 of the Code.

## Article 27 - Crimes and Punishments

(d) (1) Subject to the provisions of paragraphs (2) and (3) of this subsection, the alcoholic beverages inspectors in Anne Arundel County, HARFORD COUNTY, Montgomery County, and Prince George's County who investigate license violations under Article 2B of the Code may issue citations as provided in subsections (a) and (b) of this section only for the purpose of enforcing this subheading within their respective jurisdictions.

(2) Before issuing citations under this section, alcoholic beverages inspectors shall successfully complete an appropriate program of training in the proper use of arrest authority and pertinent police procedure as required by the board of license commissioners.

(3) Alcoholic beverages inspectors may not carry firearms in the performance of their duties.".
