## AMENDMENT NO. 1

On page 1, in line 2, strike "Local Officials - Offices of Sheriffs and State's Attorneys" and substitute "Executive Unit - Chief Deputy Sheriffs and Deputy State's Attorneys"; in line 3, strike "including in" and substitute "clarifying that"; in the same line, strike "local official" and substitute "executive unit"; strike beginning with "certain" in line 4 down through "exceptions" in line 5 and substitute "includes a chief deputy sheriff in the Office of the Sheriff in a county and a deputy State's Attorney in the Office of the State's Attorney in a county"; in line 6, strike "local officials" and substitute "chief deputy sheriffs and deputy State's Attorneys"; and in the same line, after the second "the" insert "county".

"BY repealing and reenacting, without amendments,

and in line 10, strike "(y)" and substitute "(m)".

## AMENDMENT NO. 2

On pages 1 and 2, strike in their entirety the lines beginning with line 17 on page 1 through line 6 on page 2, inclusive, and substitute:

- "(g) (1) "Employee" means an individual who is employed:
  - (i) by an executive unit;

(iii) in the Judicial Branch. (2) "Employee" does not include: (i) a public official; or (ii) a State official. (m) (1) "Executive unit" means a department, agency, commission, board, council, or other body of State government that: is established by law; and (i) <u>(ii)</u> is not in the Legislative Branch or the Judicial Branch of State government. (2) "Executive unit" includes: (I) a county health department unless the officials and employees of the department are expressly designated as "local officials" in § 15-807 of this title; A CHIEF DEPUTY SHERIFF IN THE OFFICE OF THE SHERIFF (II)IN A COUNTY; OR A DEPUTY STATE'S ATTORNEY IN THE OFFICE OF THE (III)STATE'S ATTORNEY IN A COUNTY.".
