## AMENDMENTS TO SENATE BILL NO. 38, AS AMENDED (Third Reading File Bill)

## AMENDMENT NO. 1

On page 1 of the bill, in line 2, after "Services" insert "<u>Board</u>"; in line 3, strike "<u>Definitions</u> and <u>Regulations</u>" and substitute "<u>Study</u>"; strike beginning with "<u>altering</u>" in line 7 down through "<u>transport</u>" in line 9 and substitute "<u>requiring a certain study be completed by the Emergency</u> <u>Medical Services Board</u>"; strike in their entirety lines 10 through 14, inclusive; and in line 16, strike "the Laws of Maryland read as follows".

## AMENDMENT NO. 2

Strike in its entirety the Environmental Matters Committee Amendment (SB0038/680116/1).

On pages 1 through 6 of the bill, strike in their entirety the lines beginning with line 17 on page 1 through line 9 on page 6, inclusive, and substitute:

"(a) <u>The Emergency Medical Services Board shall conduct a study of the operation of</u> <u>ambulance services in the State.</u>

- (b) <u>The study shall include:</u>
  - (1) <u>A review of the safety and effectiveness of current ambulance services;</u>

(2) An evaluation of the use and effectiveness of the current regulations governing ambulance services in the State; and

(3) <u>Suggestions for improvements in current ambulance services.</u>

(c) The Emergency Medical Services Board shall report to the General Assembly on or before June 30, 2002, in accordance with § 2-1246 of the State Government Article, on the findings

of the study of ambulance services in the State.".

On page 6 of the bill, in line 11, after "2001." insert "<u>It shall remain effective for a period of</u> <u>one year and, at the end of June 30, 2002, with no further action required by the General Assembly,</u> <u>this Act shall be abrogated and of no further force and effect.</u>".
