

- 17 (I) HAVE APPLIED FOR TRAINING AND SERVICES TO BE FUNDED
- 18 BY THE STEP PROGRAM IN THE PRIOR CALENDAR YEAR:
- 19 (II) ARE PURSUING SKILLS-BASED TRAINING AND THE EXTENT TO
- 20 WHICH THESE INDIVIDUALS ARE SUCCEEDING IN THE TRAINING;
- 21 (III) HAVE SUCCESSFULLY COMPLETED SKILLS-BASED TRAINING:
- 22 (IV) ARE RECEIVING WRAPAROUND SERVICES FUNDED BY THE
- 23 STEP PROGRAM AND THE TYPE OF SERVICES FUNDED;
- 24 (V) HAVE OBTAINED ADVANCED EMPLOYMENT ON COMPLETION
- 25 OF SKILLS-BASED TRAINING AND ANY CHANGE IN WAGES OR BENEFITS RECEIVED;
- 26 AND
- 27 (VI) ARE PARTICIPATING IN EMPLOYER-BASED TRAINING
- 28 PROGRAMS AND THE NUMBER AND TYPES OF EMPLOYERS PARTICIPATING IN THESE
- 29 PROGRAMS; AND
- 30 (2) PROVIDE THE RESULTS OF THE PERFORMANCE EVALUATION OF THE
- 31 STEP PROGRAM BASED ON THE STANDARDS ESTABLISHED BY THE BOARD UNDER §
- 32 18-404 OF THIS SUBTITLE.
- 33 18-408.
- THIS SUBTITLE MAY BE CITED AS THE "STEP PROGRAM".

- 1 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That it is the intent of the
- 2 General Assembly that if a portion of the STEP Program is funded with moneys from
- 3 the federal Temporary Assistance to Needy Families (TANF) block grant, a local
- 4 workforce investment board that receives a STEP Program grant shall make best
- 5 efforts to direct a proportionate amount of STEP Program funds to services for
- 6 individuals who are current or recent recipients of TANF Program or Family
- 7 Investment Program services.
- 8 SECTION 3. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That it is the intent of the
- 9 General Assembly that a local workforce investment board that receives a STEP
- 10 Program grant shall make best efforts to ensure that STEP Program funds are
- 11 directed primarily toward services for low-income working parents.
- 12 SECTION 2. 4. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take
- 13 effect July 1, 2001. It shall remain effective for a period of 4 years and, at the end of
- 14 June 30, 2005, with no further action required by the General Assembly, this Act shall
- 15 be abrogated and of no further force and effect.
