1 AN	N ACT concerning	
2	<u>Charles County - Highways - Prohibition on Use for Solicitations</u>	
3 FO	OR the purpose of authorizing the State Highway Administration or a local	
4	authority County Commissioners of Charles County to prohibit the use of a	
5	controlled access highway in the county's jurisdiction by a person soliciting	
6	money, donations, employment, business, or a ride from an occupant of a vehicle	
7	on the controlled access highway; prohibiting, except under certain	
8	circumstances, a person from standing in a roadway to solicit money or	
9 10	donations from an occupant of a vehicle; prohibiting, in Charles County, a	
10	person from standing in a <u>roadway</u> , median divider, or intersection to solicit <del>a</del> ride, employment, business, money money or donations from an occupant of a	
12	vehicle; and generally relating to restrictions on the use of highways in Charles	
13	County for solicitation.

- 8 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF
- 9 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

## 10 Article - Transportation

- 12 (d) "Controlled access highway" means a highway or roadway to or from which
- 13 persons, including the owners or occupants of abutting lands, have no right of access
- 14 except at the points and in the manner determined by the public authority with
- 15 jurisdiction over the highway or roadway.
- 16 21-313.
- 17 (a) The State Highway Administration, by order, or any local authority, by
- 18 ordinance, may prohibit the use of any controlled access highway in its jurisdiction by
- 19 parades, funeral processions, bicycles, or other nonmotorized traffic f or 1, by any
- 20 person operating a motorcycle, OR.
- 21 (B) THE COUNTY COMMISSIONERS OF CHARLES COUNTY, BY ORDINANCE,
- 22 MAY PROHIBIT THE USE OF ANY CONTROLLED ACCESS HIGHWAY IN THE COUNTY'S
- 23 JURISDICTION BY ANY PERSON TO SOLICIT MONEY, DONATIONS OF ANY KIND,
- 24 EMPLOYMENT, BUSINESS, OR A RIDE FROM THE OCCUPANT OF ANY VEHICLE ON THE
- 25 CONTROLLED ACCESS HIGHWAY.
- 26 (b) (C) The State Highway Administration or the local authority adopting
- 27 any prohibition under subsection (a) of this section shall place and maintain signs on
- 28 the controlled access highway to which the prohibition is applicable. If signs are so
- 29 placed, a person may not disobey the restrictions stated on them.

- 31 (a) Except for the occupant of a disabled vehicle who seeks the aid of another
- 32 vehicle, a person may not stand in a roadway, MEDIAN DIVIDER, OR INTERSECTION to
- 33 solicit a ride, employment, for business, MONEY, OR DONATIONS OF ANY KIND from
- 34 the occupant of any vehicle.
- 35 (b) A person may not stand on or near a highway to solicit any other person to
- 36 watch or guard any vehicle while it is parked or about to be parked on a highway.

- 1 (C) IN CHARLES COUNTY, A PERSON MAY NOT STAND IN A ROADWAY, MEDIAN DIVIDER, OR INTERSECTION TO SOLICIT MONEY OR DONATIONS OF ANY KIND FROM
- 3 THE OCCUPANT OF A VEHICLE.
- SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect
- 5 October June 1, 2001.
