



27	(c) (2) The regulations shall, at a minimum, require:
28 29	(i) Each ambulance operated by the ambulance service to be equipped with adequate equipment and supplies to:
30	1. Care for the patients being transported; and
31	2. Communicate with the dispatcher;
32 33	(ii) At least 1 individual, in addition to the driver, be in attendance on the ambulance during each transport who:

1 2	1. Is certified or licensed by the State as an emergency medical technician under § 13-516 of this subtitle; or
	2. Has successfully completed a course of training determined by the Institute to be substantially equivalent to the training necessary for certification or licensure as an emergency medical technician; [and]

27 28	The [Insect Sting] Emergency Treatment Program FOR ALLERGIC REACTIONS is a program in the Department for the purpose of providing a means of authorizing certain individuals to administer life-saving treatment to persons who have severe adverse reactions to insect stings, FOOD, OR A FOOD ADDITIVE when physician services or emergency medical services are not immediately available.

31	(a) In this subtitle the following words have the meanings indicated.
32 33	(b) "Certificate" means a certificate issued by the Department or a private or public entity to administer subcutaneous injections of epinephrine.
34	(C) "FOOD ADDITIVE" MEANS THE LIST OF INGREDIENTS ADDED DIRECTLY OR





- 1 of epinephrine to a person suffering or believed by the certificate holder to be
- 2 suffering a severe adverse reaction to an insect sting, FOOD, OR A FOOD ADDITIVE.

- 4 (a) A cause of action may not arise against a certificate holder authorized
- 5 under this subtitle for any act or omission when the certificate holder is acting in good
- 6 faith while rendering emergency treatment to a person suffering or believed by the
- 7 certificate holder to be suffering a severe adverse reaction to an insect sting, FOOD, OR
- 8 A FOOD ADDITIVE, except where the conduct of the certificate holder amounts to gross
- 9 negligence, willful or wanton misconduct, or intentionally tortious conduct.
- 10 (b) A cause of action may not arise against any physician for any act or
- 11 omission when the physician in good faith prescribes epinephrine and the necessary
- 12 paraphernalia for the administration of a subcutaneous injection of epinephrine to an
- 13 individual certified by the Department under § 13-706 of this subtitle.
- 14 (c) This section does not affect, and may not be construed as affecting, any
- 15 immunities from civil liability or defenses established by any other provision of the
- 16 Code or by common law to which a volunteer or physician may be entitled.

- 18 (a) This subtitle may not be construed to create a duty upon any individual to
- 19 obtain a certificate under this subtitle, and an individual may not be held civilly liable
- 20 for failing to obtain a certificate under this subtitle.
- 21 (b) An individual may not be held civilly liable in any action arising from or in
- 22 connection with the administration of A SUBCUTANEOUS INJECTION OF epinephrine
- 23 by the individual solely because the individual did not possess a certificate issued
- 24 under this subtitle.

- 26 (a) Each food service facility which prepares food and provides seating for
- 27 patrons shall post a diagram or illustrative directions on the use of manual
- 28 maneuvers to prevent asphyxiation due to choking.
- 29 (b) [A person] AN INDIVIDUAL who applies the maneuvers depicted in a
- 30 diagram posted under SUBSECTION (A) OF this section to remove food lodged in the
- 31 throat of another is liable only if the [person's] INDIVIDUAL'S actions amount to gross
- 32 negligence.
- 33 (C) AN EMPLOYEE, LESSEE, MANAGER, OR OWNER OF A FOOD SERVICE
- 34 FACILITY WHO IS CERTIFIED UNDER THE PROVISIONS OF TITLE 13, SUBTITLE 7 OF
- 35 THIS ARTICLE MAY USE AN EPINEPHRINE AUTO-INJECTOR OR EQUIVALENT DEVICE
- 36 TO ADMINISTER A SUBCUTANEOUS INJECTION OF EPINEPHRINE TO ANY PATRON

- 3 SECTION MUST DIAL 911 TO:
- 4 (1) REPORT THE ALLERGIC REACTION; AND
- 5 (2) REQUEST EMERGENCY MEDICAL SERVICES.
- 6 (E) AN EMPLOYEE, LESSEE, MANAGER, OR OWNER OF A FOOD SERVICE
