10 (A) IN THIS SECTION, "POW/MIA FLAG" MEANS THE POW/MIA FLAG OF THE
11 NATIONAL LEAGUE OF FAMILIES OF AMERICAN PRISONERS AND MISSING IN

13 (B) THE POW/MIA FLAG FOLLOWING FLAGS SHALL BE FLOWN YEAR ROUND AT
14 EACH REST AREA, WELCOME CENTER, AND EXHIBIT CENTER WITHIN INTERSTATE
15 AND STATE HIGHWAY RIGHTS-OF-WAY:

16 (1) THE FLAG OF THE UNITED STATES:

17 <u>(2)</u> <u>THE STATE FLAG; AND</u>

18(3)THE POW/MIA FLAG OF THE NATIONAL LEAGUE OF FAMILIES OF19AMERICAN PRISONERS AND MISSING IN SOUTHEAST ASIA.

20 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect 21 October 1, 2001.
