1 (V) TUTORING IN SUBJECTS SPECIFIED IN THE PROPOSAL; OR 2 (VI) FIELD TRIPS TO LOCATIONS DESCRIBED IN THE PROPOSAL. A COUNTY BOARD SHALL INCLUDE IN A PROPOSAL THE ESTIMATED (2) 4 COST OF EXTENDING THE CONTRACTS OF PARTICIPATING TEACHERS.
