2 Vehicle Laws - Use of Hand-Held Telephone While Driving - Prohibition

- 3 FOR the purpose of prohibiting the driver of a motor vehicle that is in motion from
- 4 using a telephone that is held by the driver; providing a penalty for the use of a
- 5 telephone under prohibited circumstances; and generally relating to prohibiting
- 6 the driver of a motor vehicle from using a hand-held telephone while the vehicle
- 7 is in motion.

- 18 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF
- 19 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:
- 20 Article Transportation
- 21 21-1123.
- 22 A DRIVER OF A MOTOR VEHICLE THAT IS IN MOTION MAY NOT OPERATE A
- 23 TELEPHONE THAT IS HELD BY THE DRIVER WHILE IN USE.
- 24 27-101.
- 25 (a) It is a misdemeanor for any person to violate any of the provisions of the
- 26 Maryland Vehicle Law unless the violation:

- 1 (1) Is declared to be a felony by the Maryland Vehicle Law or by any 2 other law of this State; or
- $3 \hspace{1cm} (2) \hspace{1cm}$ Is punishable by a civil penalty under the applicable provision of the 4 Maryland Vehicle Law.
- 5 (b) Except as otherwise provided in this section, any person convicted of a 6 misdemeanor for the violation of any of the provisions of the Maryland Vehicle Law is 7 subject to a fine of not more than \$500.
- 8 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect 9 October 1, 2001.
