in the regular Army or Air Force, as the case may be. Subsistence and allowances
shall be accorded the same treatment for income tax purposes under the laws of this
State as granted by the United States Internal Revenue Code, and regulations
promulgated thereunder for federal income tax purposes; and such subsistence and
allowances shall not be used in calculating the salary base for retirement purposes for
any employee who is a member of the Employees' Retirement System of the State of
Maryland.

(f) An individual who holds more than one of the above-mentioned offices
simultaneously shall receive only the pay allowances and subsistence provided herein
for a single office.
