

17 18	(1) the county executive and county council of a charter county with a county executive;	
19	(2) the county council of a charter county with no county executive;

25	(b) By action as in the regular routine for legislative enactment, the governing body of a county or municipal corporation may determine the circumstances under which the police officers and other officers, agents, and employees of the county or municipal corporation, together with all necessary equipment, may lawfully go or be

indemnify and hold harmless the other parties to the agreement

- 3 (f) The governing body of a county or municipal corporation in the State may
- 4 obtain or extend the necessary public liability insurance to cover claims that arise out
- 5 of mutual aid agreements made with another county or municipal corporation outside

- 7 (g) The police officers and other officers, agents, and employees coming into
- 8 the State under a reciprocal agreement under this section, may enforce the laws of the
- 9 State to the same extent as authorized law enforcement officers of a county or
- 10 municipal corporation in the State.
- SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take
- 12 effect October 1, 2001.
