CHAPTER
1 AN ACT concerning
2 Criminal Procedure - Mutual Aid Agreements - Nonemergency Aid
FOR the purpose of expanding the authority of certain governing bodies to enter into certain mutual aid agreements under certain nonemergency circumstances; and generally relating to mutual aid agreements.
6 BY repealing and reenacting, with amendments, 7 Article - Criminal Procedure 8 Section 2-105 9 Annotated Code of Maryland 10 (As enacted by Chapter (S.B/H.B) (1lr0739) of the Acts of the 11 General Assembly of 2001)
SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:
14 Article - Criminal Procedure
15 2-105.
16 (a) In this section, "governing body" means:
the county executive and county council of a charter county with a county executive;
19 (2) the county council of a charter county with no county executive;

the board of county commissioners of a county; or

- 1 (4) the mayor and council, by whatever name known, of a municipal 2 corporation.
- 3 By action as in the regular routine for legislative enactment, the governing 4 body of a county or municipal corporation may determine the circumstances under
- 5 which the police officers and other officers, agents, and employees of the county or
- 6 municipal corporation, together with all necessary equipment, may lawfully go or be
- sent beyond the boundaries of the county or municipal corporation to any place within
- 8 or outside the State.
- 9 The acts done by the police officers or other officers, agents, or (1) employees of a county or municipal corporation under the authority of subsection (b) 10
- of this section and the expenditures made by the county or municipal corporation are
- considered to be for a public and governmental purpose.
- 13 When a county or municipal corporation is acting through its police
- 14 officers or other officers, agents, or employees for a public or governmental purpose
- 15 beyond its boundaries under this section or other lawful authority, the county or
- 16 municipal corporation has the same immunities from liability that the county or
- municipal corporation has when acting through its police officers or other officers,
- 18 agents, or employees for a public or governmental purpose within its boundaries.
- 19 When the police officers or other officers, agents, or employees of a
- 20 county or municipal corporation are acting beyond the boundaries of the county or
- 21 municipal corporation within the State under this section or other lawful authority,
- 22 the police officers and other officers, agents, and employees of the county or municipal
- 23 corporation have the same immunity from liability described in § 5-612 of the Courts
- 24 Article and exemptions from laws, ordinances, and regulations, and the same
- 25 pension, relief, disability, workers' compensation, and other benefits as those persons
- 26 have while performing their duties within the boundaries of the county or municipal
- 27 corporation.
- 28 In accordance with subsection (b) of this section, Allegany County and a
- 29 municipal corporation in that county may make a reciprocal agreement to provide
- police officers and other officers, employees, and agents, together with all necessary
- equipment.
- The governing body of a county or municipal corporation or the 32 (e)
- 33 Maryland-National Capital Park and Planning Commission may make a reciprocal
- 34 agreement for the period that it considers advisable with the District of Columbia or
- 35 a county, municipal corporation, or the Maryland-National Capital Park and
- 36 Planning Commission, within or outside the State, and establish and carry out a plan
- 37 to provide mutual aid by providing its police officers and other officers, employees,
- 38 and agents, together with all necessary equipment[, in an emergency] AS PROVIDED
- 39 IN SUBSECTION (B) OF THIS SECTION.
- 40 A county, municipal corporation, or the Maryland-National Capital
- 41 Park and Planning Commission may not make a reciprocal agreement unless the
- 42 agreement provides that each party shall:

- 1 (i) waive any and all claims that are against the other parties to 2 the agreement and that may arise out of their activities outside their respective 3 jurisdictions under the agreement; and
- 4 (ii) indemnify and hold harmless the other parties to the agreement 5 from all claims by third parties that are for property damage or personal injury and
- 6 that may arise out of the activities of the other parties to the agreement outside their
- 7 respective jurisdictions under the agreement.
- 8 (f) The governing body of a county or municipal corporation in the State may 9 obtain or extend the necessary public liability insurance to cover claims that arise out 10 of mutual aid agreements made with another county or municipal corporation outside 11 the State.
- 12 (g) The police officers and other officers, agents, and employees coming into 13 the State under a reciprocal agreement under this section, may enforce the laws of the
- 14 State to the same extent as authorized law enforcement officers of a county or
- 15 municipal corporation in the State.
- SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take 17 effect October 1, 2001.
