22 23	SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:
24	Article 19 - St. Mary's County

26	A. In this section, the following words have the meanings indicated.
27 28	"County" means the body politic and corporate of the State of Maryland known as the County Commissioners of St. Mary's County.

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1 "Fire fighting equipment" means:			
2 (1) Necessary furnishings;			
3 (2) Fire fighting, rescue and emergency medical equipmen	t; and		
4 (3) Fixed, permanent equipment used and operated by volu 5 ambulance, and rescue departments.	inteer fire,		
"Fund" means the St. Mary's County Capital Revolving Financial Fund for FireFighting Equipment and Facilities.			
8 "Land acquisition" means the acquisition of real and personal property for the 9 construction of buildings to house fire fighting, rescue and emergency medical service 10 equipment and services.			
 "Construction" means construction, reconstruction, improvement, enlargement, expansion, alteration, rehabilitation, and repair of buildings and facilities necessary for the operation of volunteer fire, ambulance, and rescue departments. 			
 "Construction costs" includes, BUT IS NOT LIMITED TO, architects' and engineers' fees, costs of building means of access, and costs of extending utility systems. 			
16B.There is a continuing, nonlapsing, revolving [fund] FUND for fire fighting17equipment and facilities in St. Mary's County that consists of:			
18 (1) Money appropriated by the county to the [fund] FUND);		
19(2)Any repayment of principal of or interest on a loan made20 [fund] FUND;	de from the

26 (5) Investment earnings on the [fund] FUND.

C. The [fund] FUND shall be managed and supervised as prescribed by the
Board of County Commissioners of the county. The [fund] FUND shall be invested
and reinvested in the same manner as other county funds. Any investment earnings
on the [fund] FUND (including interest on loans made from the [fund] FUND) to the
extent not expended or obligated within any fiscal year shall be [paid into the county
general fund] CREDITED TO THE FUND FOR ITS GROWTH TO PROVIDE ADDITIONAL
REVENUES TO THE FIRE, AMBULANCE, AND RESCUE DEPARTMENTS EVEN IF THESE
DEPARTMENTS ARE MERGED INTO ONE ENTITY.

35D.(1)In order to provide moneys for appropriation to the [fund] FUND, the36county is hereby authorized and empowered to borrow money and incur indebtedness.

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1 To evidence such borrowing, the county is hereby authorized and empowered to issue

2 and sell upon its full faith and credit general obligation bonds at any time and from

3 time to time for such purposes, provided that the aggregate principal amount of bonds

4 issued and outstanding under this section, together with the principal amount of any

5 alternative financing pursuant to Subsection K hereof, shall not exceed [\$2,000,000]

6 \$3,000,000. The authority to issue general obligation bonds conferred hereby shall be 7 deemed to provide an additional and alternative authority for borrowing money and

8 shall be regarded as supplemental and additional to any authority to issue general

9 obligation bonds conferred by other laws.

10 E. (1) The purpose of the [fund] FUND is to provide low interest loans to
11 volunteer fire, ambulance, and rescue departments that are members in good
12 standing of the St. Mary's County Fire Board or the St. Mary's County Ambulance and
13 Rescue Association for the following purposes:

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(a) To finance the purchase of fire fighting equipment; and

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(b) To finance land acquisition and construction costs.

16 F. (1) The [fund] FUND shall be charged with all expenses of administering 17 the provisions of this section.

18 (2) The [fund] FUND may not be used for operational expenses of the19 volunteer fire, ambulance, and rescue departments.

20G.(1)A volunteer fire, ambulance, or rescue department shall apply for21loans FROM THE FUND ESTABLISHED under this section on forms as prescribed by the22Board of County Commissioners.

23 (2) The application shall contain information necessary to evaluate the 24 requested loan for need, financial ability of borrower, sources of repayment, proposed 25 costs and expenditures, fair value of complete projects, normal or useful life of 26 equipment security for the loan, and other information as may be appropriate or

27 useful in evaluating the loan application.

- 28 (3) The St. Mary's County Fire Board shall:

29 (a) Review and evaluate loan applications from the volunteer fire30 departments for need, practicality, and financial ability of the borrower; and

(b) [Assign an order of priority to the application from the
 volunteer fire departments prior to submission to the county] PREPARE A WRITTEN
 RECOMMENDATION FOR THE NEED, PRACTICALITY, AND FINANCIAL ABILITY OF A
 LOAN APPLICANT AND FORWARD THE RECOMMENDATION TO THE ST. MARY'S
 COUNTY EMERGENCY SERVICES COMMITTEE.

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(4) The St. Mary's County Ambulance and Rescue Association shall:

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1 Review and evaluate loan applications from the volunteer (a) 2 ambulance and rescue departments for need, practicality, and financial ability of the 3 borrower; and 4 [Assign an order of priority to the application from the (b) 5 volunteer ambulance and rescue departments prior to submission to the county] 6 PREPARE A WRITTEN RECOMMENDATION FOR THE NEED, PRACTICALITY, AND 7 FINANCIAL ABILITY OF A LOAN APPLICANT AND FORWARD THE RECOMMENDATION 8 TO THE ST. MARY'S COUNTY EMERGENCY SERVICES COMMITTEE. 9 (5)THE ST. MARY'S COUNTY EMERGENCY SERVICES COMMITTEE SHALL: 10 (A) EVALUATE THE RECOMMENDATIONS OF THE ST. MARY'S 11 COUNTY FIRE BOARD AND THE ST. MARY'S COUNTY AMBULANCE AND RESCUE 12 ASSOCIATION FOR CONTENT AND ASSIGN A PRIORITY BASED ON THE AVAILABILITY 13 OF LOAN FUNDS IN THE FUND, PAST REQUESTS, NEED OF THE RESPECTIVE 14 ORGANIZATIONS, AND ANY OTHER RELEVANT FACTORS APPLICABLE DURING ITS 15 DELIBERATIONS; AND FORWARD ALL LOAN APPLICATIONS AND SUBMIT ITS PRIORITY 16 (B) 17 RECOMMENDATIONS TO THE COUNTY COMMISSIONERS. 18 An officer of the county designated by the Board of County [(5)](6) 19 Commissioners shall review loan applications in accordance with the priority 20 assigned by the [St. Mary's County Fire Board and the St. Mary's County Ambulance 21 and Rescue Association] ST. MARY'S COUNTY EMERGENCY SERVICES COMMITTEE. Subject to the provisions of Subsections E and F of this section, 22 [(6)] (7)23 a loan may be approved by the County Commissioners up to the amount requested BY 24 A LOAN APPLICANT if sufficient moneys exist in the [fund] FUND. 25 J. Any and all interest income derived from loans from the [fund] FUND are 26 exempt from state, county, or other taxation of every kind and nature in the state. 27 Κ. Notwithstanding any other provision of this section, the county may 28 finance the purchase of fire fighting equipment and land acquisition and construction 29 costs for the benefit of volunteer fire, ambulance and rescue departments that are 30 members in good standing of the St. Mary's County Fire Board or the St. Mary's 31 County ambulance and Rescue Association by any means which the Board of County 32 Commissioners determines to be reasonable and appropriate to accomplish the 33 purposes of this section, including, without limitation, lease purchase agreements or 34 other alternative financing arrangements. Applications for financing under this 35 subsection shall be made and processed in the same manner and upon the same 36 conditions prescribed by this section for loans from the [fund] FUND. The acquisition 37 of equipment or other property pursuant to this subsection shall not be subject to any 38 procurement or similar procedures that would otherwise be applicable.

39 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect40 October 1, 2001.

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
