1 AN ACT concerning

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St. Mary's County - Capital Revolving Financial Fund for Fire Fighting Equipment and Facilities

4 FOR the purpose of providing for investment earnings on the St. Mary's County

- 5 Capital Revolving Financial Fund for Fire Fighting Equipment and Facilities to
- 6 be credited to the Fund instead of being paid into the St. Mary's County general
- 7 fund; increasing the amount of general obligation bonding authority of the
- 8 County Commissioners of St. Mary's County for the purpose of providing
- 9 appropriations to the Fund; altering the loan application process to require the
- 10 St. Mary's County Fire Board and the Ambulance and Rescue Association to
- 11 prepare a certain recommendation of a certain loan applicant; requiring the St.
- 12 Mary's County Emergency Services Committee to evaluate certain
- 13 recommendations of certain loan applications in a certain manner; providing the
- 14 criteria for review of certain recommendations of certain loan applications; and
- 15 generally relating to the St. Mary's County Capital Revolving Financial Fund
- 16 for Fire Fighting Equipment and Facilities.

22 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF

23 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

3 A. In this	section, the following words have the meanings indicated.
4 "County" means the body politic and corporate of the State of Maryland known5 as the County Commissioners of St. Mary's County.	
6 "Fire fighting equipment" means:	
7 (1)	Necessary furnishings;
8 (2)	Fire fighting, rescue and emergency medical equipment; and
9 (3) 10 ambulance, and resc	Fixed, permanent equipment used and operated by volunteer fire, ue departments.
"Fund" means the St. Mary's County Capital Revolving Financial Fund for FireFighting Equipment and Facilities.	
 "Land acquisition" means the acquisition of real and personal property for the construction of buildings to house fire fighting, rescue and emergency medical service equipment and services. 	
 "Construction" means construction, reconstruction, improvement, enlargement, expansion, alteration, rehabilitation, and repair of buildings and facilities necessary for the operation of volunteer fire, ambulance, and rescue departments. 	
"Construction costs" includes, BUT IS NOT LIMITED TO, architects' and engineers'fees, costs of building means of access, and costs of extending utility systems.	
 B. There is a continuing, nonlapsing, revolving [fund] FUND for fire fighting equipment and facilities in St. Mary's County that consists of: 	
23 (1)	Money appropriated by the county to the [fund] FUND;
24 (2) 25 [fund] FUND;	Any repayment of principal of or interest on a loan made from the
 26 (3) Proceeds from the sale, lease, rental or other disposal of property or 27 other collateral held or acquired by the county to secure the repayment of a loan made 28 from the [fund] FUND; 	
29 (4) 30 including, without li	Moneys from any source to effect the purposes of this section, mitation, any federal, state, or private grant; and
31 (5)	Investment earnings on the [fund] FUND.
C. The [fund] FUND shall be managed and supervised as prescribed by the Board of County Commissioners of the county. The [fund] FUND shall be invested	

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1 and reinvested in the same manner as other county funds. Any investment earnings

2 on the [fund] FUND (including interest on loans made from the [fund] FUND) to the 3 extent not expended or obligated within any fiscal year shall be [paid into the county 4 general fund] CREDITED TO THE FUND FOR ITS GROWTH TO PROVIDE ADDITIONAL 5 REVENUES TO THE FIRE, AMBULANCE, AND RESCUE DEPARTMENTS EVEN IF THESE 6 DEPARTMENTS ARE MERGED INTO ONE ENTITY. 7 D. In order to provide moneys for appropriation to the [fund] FUND, the (1)8 county is hereby authorized and empowered to borrow money and incur indebtedness. 9 To evidence such borrowing, the county is hereby authorized and empowered to issue 10 and sell upon its full faith and credit general obligation bonds at any time and from 11 time to time for such purposes, provided that the aggregate principal amount of bonds 12 issued and outstanding under this section, together with the principal amount of any 13 alternative financing pursuant to Subsection K hereof, shall not exceed [\$2,000,000] 14 \$3,000,000. The authority to issue general obligation bonds conferred hereby shall be 15 deemed to provide an additional and alternative authority for borrowing money and 16 shall be regarded as supplemental and additional to any authority to issue general 17 obligation bonds conferred by other laws. 18 E. The purpose of the [fund] FUND is to provide low interest loans to (1)19 volunteer fire, ambulance, and rescue departments that are members in good 20 standing of the St. Mary's County Fire Board or the St. Mary's County Ambulance and 21 Rescue Association for the following purposes: 22 (a) To finance the purchase of fire fighting equipment; and 23 (b) To finance land acquisition and construction costs. 24 F. (1)The [fund] FUND shall be charged with all expenses of administering 25 the provisions of this section. 26 The [fund] FUND may not be used for operational expenses of the (2)27 volunteer fire, ambulance, and rescue departments. 28 A volunteer fire, ambulance, or rescue department shall apply for G. (1)29 loans FROM THE FUND ESTABLISHED under this section on forms as prescribed by the 30 Board of County Commissioners. The application shall contain information necessary to evaluate the 31 (2)32 requested loan for need, financial ability of borrower, sources of repayment, proposed 33 costs and expenditures, fair value of complete projects, normal or useful life of 34 equipment security for the loan, and other information as may be appropriate or

35 useful in evaluating the loan application.

36 (3) The St. Mary's County Fire Board shall:

37 (a) Review and evaluate loan applications from the volunteer fire38 departments for need, practicality, and financial ability of the borrower; and

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1 [Assign an order of priority to the application from the (b) volunteer fire departments prior to submission to the county] PREPARE A WRITTEN 2 3 RECOMMENDATION FOR THE NEED, PRACTICALITY, AND FINANCIAL ABILITY OF A 4 LOAN APPLICANT AND FORWARD THE RECOMMENDATION TO THE ST. MARY'S **5 COUNTY EMERGENCY SERVICES COMMITTEE.** 6 (4)The St. Mary's County Ambulance and Rescue Association shall: 7 Review and evaluate loan applications from the volunteer (a) 8 ambulance and rescue departments for need, practicality, and financial ability of the 9 borrower: and 10 (b) [Assign an order of priority to the application from the 11 volunteer ambulance and rescue departments prior to submission to the county] 12 PREPARE A WRITTEN RECOMMENDATION FOR THE NEED, PRACTICALITY, AND 13 FINANCIAL ABILITY OF A LOAN APPLICANT AND FORWARD THE RECOMMENDATION 14 TO THE ST. MARY'S COUNTY EMERGENCY SERVICES COMMITTEE. 15 (5) THE ST. MARY'S COUNTY EMERGENCY SERVICES COMMITTEE SHALL: EVALUATE THE RECOMMENDATIONS OF THE ST. MARY'S 16 (A) 17 COUNTY FIRE BOARD AND THE ST. MARY'S COUNTY AMBULANCE AND RESCUE 18 ASSOCIATION FOR CONTENT AND ASSIGN A PRIORITY BASED ON THE AVAILABILITY 19 OF LOAN FUNDS IN THE FUND, PAST REQUESTS, NEED OF THE RESPECTIVE 20 ORGANIZATIONS, AND ANY OTHER RELEVANT FACTORS APPLICABLE DURING ITS 21 DELIBERATIONS; AND FORWARD ALL LOAN APPLICATIONS AND SUBMIT ITS PRIORITY 22 **(B)** 23 RECOMMENDATIONS TO THE COUNTY COMMISSIONERS. 24 (6) An officer of the county designated by the Board of County [(5)]25 Commissioners shall review loan applications in accordance with the priority 26 assigned by the [St. Mary's County Fire Board and the St. Mary's County Ambulance 27 and Rescue Association] ST. MARY'S COUNTY EMERGENCY SERVICES COMMITTEE. 28 Subject to the provisions of Subsections E and F of this section, [(6)](7)29 a loan may be approved by the County Commissioners up to the amount requested BY 30 A LOAN APPLICANT if sufficient moneys exist in the [fund] FUND. 31 Any and all interest income derived from loans from the [fund] FUND are J. 32 exempt from state, county, or other taxation of every kind and nature in the state. Notwithstanding any other provision of this section, the county may 33 K. 34 finance the purchase of fire fighting equipment and land acquisition and construction 35 costs for the benefit of volunteer fire, ambulance and rescue departments that are 36 members in good standing of the St. Mary's County Fire Board or the St. Mary's 37 County ambulance and Rescue Association by any means which the Board of County 38 Commissioners determines to be reasonable and appropriate to accomplish the 39 purposes of this section, including, without limitation, lease purchase agreements or 40 other alternative financing arrangements. Applications for financing under this

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1 subsection shall be made and processed in the same manner and upon the same

- 2 conditions prescribed by this section for loans from the [fund] FUND. The acquisition
- 3 of equipment or other property pursuant to this subsection shall not be subject to any
- 4 procurement or similar procedures that would otherwise be applicable.

5 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect 6 October 1, 2001.
