1 AN ACT concerning

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Circuit Courts - Court Administrators - Seventh Judicial Circuit

3 FOR the purpose of repealing provisions of law establishing an administrative office

- 4 of the courts of the seventh judicial circuit and the position of administrator;
- 5 authorizing a court administrator in each county of the seventh judicial circuit;
- 6 providing for the appointment and tenure of a court administrator; requiring a
- 7 court administrator to devote time and attention to the tasks, duties, and
- 8 responsibilities that the county administrative judge prescribes; authorizing a
- 9 court administrator to appoint certain employees; requiring each county
- 10 government to provide compensation for the employees and certain expenses;
- 11 prohibiting a court administrator from engaging in the practice of law; and
- 12 generally relating to court administrators in the seventh judicial circuit.

23 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF

24 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

 (a) There is an administrative office of courts of the seventh judicial circuit, 4 headed by an administrator. The administrator is appointed by and holds office 5 during the pleasure of the judges of the seventh judicial circuit. He shall devote time 6 to his official duties as the judges prescribe. He shall have the salary and allowances 7 prescribed and set by the county governments of Prince George's, St. Mary's, Calvert, 8 and Charles Counties. His salary shall be paid one half by Prince George's County, 9 and one sixth by each of St. Mary's, Calvert, and Charles Counties.

1 (7) Prepare and submit budget estimates of appropriations necessary for 2 maintenance and operation of the courts of the seventh judicial circuit and of offices 3 related to and serving the courts as the judges direct;

4 (8) File requests for permission to spend funds appropriated for courts of 5 the seventh judicial circuit and for offices related to and serving the seventh judicial 6 circuit as the judges direct and approve all proper vouchers for expenditure of funds;

7 (9) Secure and maintain space for courtrooms and office facilities and
8 purchase, exchange, and distribute equipment and supplies for judges and offices,
9 officers, and employees of courts of the seventh judicial circuit;

19 (14) Perform additional duties assigned by the judges.

(e) The county government for each of Calvert, Charles, St. Mary's, and Prince
George's Counties shall make levies and appropriations necessary to provide for
payment of the salaries, compensation, expenses, and other costs properly incurred
under or by the provisions of this section.

24 (f) The authority of the judges of the seventh judicial circuit to appoint other 25 administrative or clerical personnel is not limited by any provision of this section.]

(A) IN EACH COUNTY OF THE SEVENTH JUDICIAL CIRCUIT, THERE MAY BE A
COURT ADMINISTRATOR. THE COURT ADMINISTRATOR SHALL BE APPOINTED BY THE
COUNTY ADMINISTRATIVE JUDGE AFTER CONSULTATION WITH THE CIRCUIT
ADMINISTRATIVE JUDGE AND SHALL HOLD OFFICE AT THE PLEASURE OF THE
COUNTY ADMINISTRATIVE JUDGE. THE COURT ADMINISTRATOR SHALL DEVOTE
TIME AND ATTENTION TO THE TASKS, DUTIES, AND RESPONSIBILITIES THAT THE
COUNTY ADMINISTRATIVE JUDGE PRESCRIBES.

34 (B) THE COURT ADMINISTRATOR, WITH THE APPROVAL OF THE COUNTY
35 ADMINISTRATIVE JUDGE, SHALL APPOINT EMPLOYEES NECESSARY TO ENABLE THE
36 ADMINISTRATOR TO PERFORM THE DUTIES ASSIGNED TO THE POSITION. EACH
37 COUNTY GOVERNMENT SHALL PROVIDE COMPENSATION FOR THE EMPLOYEES,

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TOGETHER WITH EXPENSES FOR THE PROPER PERFORMANCE OF ASSIGNED DUTIES
 OF THE COURT ADMINISTRATOR AND EMPLOYEES APPOINTED UNDER THIS SECTION.

3 (C) THE COURT ADMINISTRATOR MAY NOT ENGAGE DIRECTLY OR 4 INDIRECTLY IN THE PRACTICE OF LAW.

5 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect 6 October 1, 2001.
