1 Article 2B - Alcoholic Beverages 2 8-213.1. 3 (A) THIS SECTION APPLIES ONLY IN HARFORD COUNTY. THERE IS A STADIUM BEER AND LIGHT WINE ON-SALE LICENSE IN 4 (B) 5 HARFORD COUNTY. THE LIOUOR CONTROL BOARD MAY ISSUE A STADIUM BEER AND LIGHT 6 (C) WINE ON-SALE LICENSE TO THE OWNER OR LESSEE OF A PROFESSIONAL BASEBALL 8 STADIUM FOR USE ON THE STADIUM PREMISES. A STADIUM BEER AND LIGHT WINE ON-SALE LICENSE AUTHORIZES THE 9 (D) 10 HOLDER TO SELL BEER AND, IF SOLD WITH A MEAL, LIGHT WINE ON THE LICENSED 11 PREMISES: 12 (1) FOR CONSUMPTION ONLY ON THE LICENSED PREMISES; 13 IN A PLASTIC, STYROFOAM, OR PAPER CONTAINER, EXCEPT THAT A (2) 14 GLASS CONTAINER MAY BE USED IN AN ENCLOSED DINING AREA IN WHICH PATRONS 15 ARE SEATED: TO A PERSON PRESENT: 16 (3) 17 AT A BASEBALL GAME IN WHICH THE TEAM OF THE LICENSEE (I) 18 OR LESSEE IS PLAYING; OR 19 (II)AT ANOTHER EVENT THAT IS HELD AT THE STADIUM; AND 20 (4) DURING THE HOURS AND DAYS FOR SALE SPECIFIED IN § 11-513 OF 21 THIS ARTICLE. 22 (E) THE ANNUAL LICENSE FEE IS \$5,000. 23 (F) EXCEPT FOR A WHOLESALER OF BEER OR WINE WHO IS CONDUCTING 24 BUSINESS WITH THE LICENSEE UNDER THIS SECTION, A LICENSEE MAY NOT ALLOW 25 A PERSON TO CARRY ALCOHOLIC BEVERAGES ONTO OR FROM THE LICENSED 26 PREMISES. 27 11-513. The provisions of this section apply in Harford County only. 28 (a) 29 (b) (1) A licensee may sell, offer for sale or dispense alcoholic beverages or 30 light wine: 31 (i) On Monday through Sunday; and 32 (ii) Only between 8 a.m. and 2 a.m. the following morning.
