## 2 Vehicle Laws - Funeral Processions - Use of Warning Lamps Required

- 3 FOR the purpose of requiring the driver of a motor vehicle in a funeral procession to
- 4 use flashing warning lamps under certain circumstances; making a stylistic

- 17 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF
- 18 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

## 19 Article - Transportation

20 21-207.

- 21 (a) Notwithstanding any other provision of this title, a funeral procession
- 22 facing a red signal may continue through or make a turn at an intersection if the first
- 23 vehicle in the procession already entered the intersection before the signal changed
- 24 from green to red.
- 25 (b) While a funeral procession is proceeding through a red signal as permitted
- 26 by this section, a vehicle that is not in the procession may not enter the intersection,
- 27 even if it is facing a green signal, unless it can do so without crossing the path of the
- 28 procession. When the red signal changes to green while the funeral procession is still

- 1 within the intersection, [any] A vehicle facing a green signal may proceed, but the
- 2 funeral procession has the right-of-way.
- 3 (c) The driver of a vehicle in a funeral procession does not have any privilege
- 4 granted in this section unless:
- 5 (1) [the] THE headlights of the vehicle are turned on; AND
- 6 (2) SUBJECT TO § 22-221(G) OF THIS ARTICLE, THE WARNING LAMPS OF 7 THE VEHICLE ARE FLASHING.
- 8 22-221.
- 9 (d) Any vehicle may be equipped with lamps used for the purpose of warning
- 10 the drivers of other vehicles of the presence of a vehicular traffic hazard requiring the
- 11 exercise of unusual care in approaching, overtaking, or passing, and, when so
- 12 equipped, may display the warning in addition to any other warning signals required
- 13 by the Maryland Vehicle Law.
- 14 (e) The lamps used to display this warning to the front shall be mounted at
- 15 the same level and as widely spaced laterally as practicable and shall display
- 16 simultaneously flashing white or amber lights, or any shade of color between white
- 17 and amber. The lamps used to display this warning to the rear shall be mounted at
- 18 the same level and as widely spaced laterally as practicable and shall display
- 19 simultaneously flashing amber or red lights, or any shade of color between amber and
- 20 red.
- 21 (f) These warning lights shall be visible from a distance of not less than 1,500
- 22 feet under normal atmospheric conditions at night.
- 23 (g) Every motor vehicle that is registered in this State and that was
- 24 manufactured or assembled after June 30, 1967, and designated as a 1968 or
- 25 subsequent year model shall be equipped with these warning lamps by means of
- 26 which the driver may cause both front and both rear turn signals to flash
- 27 simultaneously as a vehicular traffic hazard warning.
- 28 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect
- 29 October 1, 2001.
