- $3\,$  FOR the purpose of establishing a Maryland Public School Supplemental Fund to
- 4 assist the counties in the State to fund the operations of the public schools in the

- funding mechanism for the Fund; establishing procedures for holding moneys in
- 7 the Fund; requiring the State Board of Education to administer the Fund;
- 8 establishing criteria for determining appropriations from the Fund; specifying
- 9 certain duties of the State Superintendent of Schools and the State Comptroller
- 10 under this Act; requiring the State Lottery Agency to deposit into the Fund the
