3 FOR the purpose of establishing in a criminal case in a circuit court that if a certain

- 6 generally relating to the time for trials of criminal cases in the circuit courts.

12 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF

13 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

Article 27 - Crimes and Punishments

- 16 (a) The date for trial of a criminal matter in a circuit court:
- 17 (1) Shall be set within 30 days after the earlier of:
- 18 (i) The appearance of counsel; or
- 19 (ii) The first appearance of the defendant before the circuit court,
- 20 as provided in the Maryland Rules; and
- 21 (2) May not be later than 180 days after the earlier of those events.
- 22 (b) (1) On motion of a party or on the court's initiative and for good cause
- 23 shown, a county administrative judge or a designee of that judge may grant a change
- 24 of the circuit court trial date.

5 (c) The Court of Appeals may adopt additional rules of practice and procedure 6 for the implementation of this section in circuit courts.

7 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect8 October 1, 2001.
