8 9 10 11 12	(ii) For each full-time equivalent student participating in the reciprocity agreement, the State shall pay to Garrett Community College an amount equal to the net State support per full-time equivalent student as provided in § 16-305 of this subtitle. 27 28	(ii) The student shall furnish a surety bond or guaranteed promissory note to the State with security satisfactory to the Maryland Higher Education Commission, that on completion of the Nursing Education Program, the student will work for at least 2 years in a hospital or related institution as defined in § 19-301 of the Health - General Article in this State.
