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Milk and Milk Products - Regulation

3 FOR the purpose of requiring a person to obtain a certain permit before the person

- 4 may transport a milk product; redesignating a milk hauler as a bulk milk
- 5 hauler/sampler; exempting certain persons from the permitting process;
- 6 increasing certain fees; establishing certain fees; altering the process for
- 7 appealing a final decision of the Secretary of Health and Mental Hygiene; and
- 8 generally relating to the regulation and permitting process for milk and milk
- 9 products.

15 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF

18 [(g)] (H) "Grade A distributor" means a person who sells a Grade A19 pasteurized milk product.

20 [(h)] (I) "Grade A Pasteurized Milk Ordinance" means the recommended 21 Grade "A" Pasteurized Milk Ordinance published by the federal government.

2 (a) Except as otherwise provided in this subtitle and in the Administrative

3 Procedure Act, before the Secretary denies an application for a permit or takes any

4 action under § 21-418 of this subtitle, the Secretary shall give the person against5 whom the action is contemplated an opportunity for a hearing before the Secretary.

6 (b) Except as otherwise provided in this section, the Secretary shall give notice 7 and hold the hearing in accordance with the Administrative Procedure Act.

8 (c) (1) Within 48 hours after the person receives notice of the Secretary's 9 action, a person whose permit has been suspended or who has received a notice that 10 the Secretary intends to suspend the permit may request a hearing.

11 (2) Within 72 hours after receiving the request for a hearing, the 12 Secretary shall hold the hearing.

13 (d) If after due notice the person for whom the hearing is held fails or refuses 14 to appear, nevertheless the Secretary may hear and determine the matter.

(e) A person aggrieved by a final decision of the Secretary in a contested case,
as defined by the Administrative Procedure Act, may [take an appeal] NOT APPEAL
TO THE BOARD OF REVIEW BUT MAY TAKE A DIRECT JUDICIAL APPEAL.
