SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF
 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

Article - Natural Resources

14 5-406.

(a) Any person who desires to cut down or trim any roadside tree shall applyto the Department for a permit, except that:

17 (1) [if] IF a tree is unrooted or its branches broken so as to contact

18 telephone, telegraph, electric power, or other wires carrying electric current, or if the 19 tree or its branches endanger persons or property, the tree or its branches may be

20 removed without first obtaining a permit from the Department; [and]

21 (2) [a] A tree standing within the right-of-way of a public road which

22 has not been surfaced with either stone, shell, gravel, concrete, brick, asphalt, or

23 other improved surface may be cut down and removed by the abutting landowner for

24 his own use without first obtaining a permit; AND

(3) A ROADSIDE TREE IN ALLEGANY COUNTY OF LESS THAN 3 INCHES IN DIAMETER MAY BE TRIMMED OR CUT DOWN BY THE COUNTY WITHOUT FIRST OBTAINING A PERMIT FROM THE DEPARTMENT.
