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HOUSE BILL 428

(I) A PARTICIPATING SCHOOL UNDER THE PILOT PROGRAM IS EXEMPT FROM
 PROVISIONS RELATING TO CHILD CARE CENTERS UNDER §§ 5-570 THROUGH 5-585.1
 OF THE FAMILY LAW ARTICLE.

4 (J) A PARTICIPATING COUNTY BOARD SHALL SUBMIT TO THE STATE BOARD 5 REPORTS EVALUATING, UNDER CRITERIA ESTABLISHED BY THE STATE BOARD, THE 6 STATUS OF THE PILOT PROGRAM BY JUNE 30, 2003, JUNE 30, 2004, AND JUNE 30, 2005.

7 (K) THE STATE BOARD SHALL SUBMIT REPORTS EVALUATING THE PILOT
8 PROGRAM TO THE GOVERNOR AND, IN ACCORDANCE WITH § 2-1246 OF THE STATE

SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That the Governor shall
include \$2,000,000 in each of the State budgets for fiscal years 2003, 2004, and 2005,
for the Maryland Extended Learning Pilot Program established under this Act, and
that these funds shall be in addition to funds provided in the State budgets for child
care and after school programs.

16 SECTION 3. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect 17 June 1, 2002. It shall remain effective for a period of 3 years and 4 months and, at the 18 end of September 30, 2005, with no further action required by the General Assembly, 19 this Act shall be abrogated and of no further force and effect.

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
