## **HOUSE BILL 445**

1 2	SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:
3	Article - Natural Resources
4	4-702.
	(a) Except as provided in subsection (b), a person may not buy, sell, ship, transport, or otherwise deal in finfish unless the person is licensed by the Department.
8 9	(b) The following persons are not required to obtain a license under this section:
10	(1) A person licensed by the Department to catch finfish for sale;
11 12	(2) A retail market, restaurant, or other establishment where finfish are sold or served to ultimate consumers, and not for resale;
13	(3) A person who buys finfish for personal use or consumption[.]; OR
14 15	(4) A PERSON WHO CATCHES OR SELLS FINFISH FOR USE AS LIVE BAIT, LIMITED TO:
16 17	(I) FISH NOT SUBJECT TO A FISHERIES MANAGEMENT PLAN IN ACCORDANCE WITH § 4-215 OF THIS TITLE; AND
18	(II) FISH NOT OTHERWISE REGULATED BY THE DEPARTMENT.
21 22 23 24 25	SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That the Department of Natural Resources shall conduct a study of bait fish harvested and sold in Maryland to determine the impact of harvesting bait fish on the ecosystem of the Chesapeake Bay. The Department shall report on this study on or before December 1, 2002 to the Senate Economic and Environmental Affairs Committee, the House Environmental Matters Committee, and, in accordance with § 2-1246 of the State Government Article, the General Assembly and include recommendations for the management or regulation of bait fish harvested or sold in Maryland.
29	SECTION 2. 3. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect October 1, 2001. <i>It shall remain effective for a period of 2 years and, at the end of September 30, 2003, with no further action required by the General Assembly, this Act shall be abrogated and of no further force and effect.</i>
