BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF 15 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows: **Article - Natural Resources** 16 17 4-702. 18 Except as provided in subsection (b), a person may not buy, sell, ship, 19 transport, or otherwise deal in finfish unless the person is licensed by the 20 Department.

4	(3) A person who buys finfish for personal use or consumption[.]; OR
5 6	(4) A PERSON WHO CATCHES OR SELLS FINFISH FOR USE AS LIVE BAIT, LIMITED TO:
7 8	(I) FISH NOT SUBJECT TO A FISHERIES MANAGEMENT PLAN IN ACCORDANCE WITH § 4-215 OF THIS TITLE; AND
9	(II) FISH NOT OTHERWISE REGULATED BY THE DEPARTMENT.
10	SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That the Department of
11	Natural Resources shall conduct a study of bait fish harvested and sold in Maryland
12	to determine the impact of harvesting bait fish on the ecosystem of the Chesapeake
	Bay. The Department shall report on this study on or before December 1, 2002 to the
	Senate Economic and Environmental Affairs Committee, the House Environmental
15	Matters Committee, and, in accordance with § 2-1246 of the State Government
16	Article, the General Assembly and include recommendations for the management or
17	regulation of bait fish harvested or sold in Maryland.
