 20 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF 21 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

24 (b) (1) There is a Health Manpower Shortage Incentive Grant Program for 25 eligible institutions.	
26 (2) The State Scholarship Administration shall administer the Grant 27 Program as provided in this section.	

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1 (3) In consultation with the Secretary of Health and Mental Hygiene, the 2 Administration shall adopt regulations to implement the Grant Program.

3 (c) An eligible institution is qualified to receive a grant under this section if 4 the institution:

5 (1) Has an approved education program leading to licensure, 6 certification, or registration in a health occupation determined to be in short supply; 7 and

8 (2) Funds the approved education program at an amount not less than 9 the preceding fiscal year.

10 (d) Except as provided in subsection (e) of this section, an eligible institution

11 shall receive a grant in the amount of \$1,500 for each student who graduates, IN

12 EXCESS OF A THRESHOLD NUMBER OF STUDENTS WHO GRADUATE ESTABLISHED BY

13 THE COMMISSION IN CONSULTATION WITH THE APPROPRIATE ELIGIBLE

14 INSTITUTIONS, from an approved education program leading to licensure,

15 certification, or registration in a health occupation determined to be in short supply[,

16 that is in excess of the total number of students who graduated from the approved

17 education program at that eligible institution during academic year 1990-91].

18 (e) (1) If the total amount of the grant to be issued under subsection (d) of

19 this section is more than the amount appropriated in the annual State Budget,

20 including the amount that is collected under the Physician Quality Assurance Fund

21 under § 14-207(c)(2)(i) of the Health Occupations Article and transferred to this

22 program, the amount of an eligible institution's grant for that period shall be equal to

23 the product of the amount required to pay grants under subsection (d) multiplied by

24 the ratio of the total amount appropriated to the eligible institution.

25 (2) Any unspent portions of the money that is transferred to the

26 Administration for use under this section by the Comptroller may not be transferred

27 to or revert to the General Fund of the State, but shall remain in the Fund

28 maintained by the Administration to administer these programs to be used for the

29 purposes specified in this section.

30 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect 31 July 1, 2001.

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
