3 FOR the purpose of altering the minimum amount in controversy in civil cases over

16 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF

- 17 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

The District Court has exclusive jurisdiction over a small claim action, which, for purposes of this section, means a civil action for money in which the amount claimed does not exceed [\$2,500] \$5,000 exclusive of interest, costs, and attorney's fees, if attorney's fees are recoverable by law or contract; and landlord tenant action under §§ 8-401 and 8-402 of the Real Property Article of the Code, in which the amount of rent claimed does not exceed [\$2,500] \$5,000 exclusive of interest and costs.

12 (a) In a civil action in the District Court, if the amount in controversy is 13 [\$1,000] \$5,000 <u>\$2,500</u> or less, there shall be no formal pleadings.

14 (b) If the amount in controversy exceeds [\$1,000] \$5,000 <u>\$2,500</u> the forms and 15 pleadings are as provided by Title 3, Chapter 300 of the Maryland Rules.

17 (f) In a civil case in which the amount in controversy exceeds [\$2,500] \$5,000 18 exclusive of interest, costs, and attorney's fees if attorney's fees are recoverable by law

20 in which the parties so agree, an appeal shall be heard on the record made in the

21 District Court. In every other case, including a criminal case in which sentence has

22 been imposed or suspended following a plea of nolo contendere or guilty, and an

23 appeal in a municipal infraction or Code violation case, an appeal shall be tried de

24 novo.

SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall be
construed only prospectively and may not be applied or interpreted to have any effect

27 on or application to any civil action filed before the effective date of this Act.

28 SECTION 3. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect 29 October 1, 2001.
