	The inspectors in Anne Arundel County, FREDERICK COUNTY, Montgomery County, and Prince George's County who investigate license violations under this article may issue civil citations as provided in Article 27, § 402 of the Code.

10 11 12	 (d) (1) Subject to the provisions of paragraphs (2) and (3) of this subsection, the alcoholic beverages inspectors in Anne Arundel County, FREDERICK COUNTY, Montgomery County, and Prince George's County who investigate license violations under Article 2B of the Code may issue citations as provided in subsections (a) and (b) e of this section only for the purpose of enforcing this subheading within their respective jurisdictions.
16	(2) Before issuing citations under this section, alcoholic beverages inspectors shall successfully complete an appropriate program of training in the proper use of arrest authority and pertinent police procedure as required by the board of license commissioners.
18	3 (3) Alcoholic beverages inspectors may not carry firearms in the
