## Docking Masters and Bay Pilots - Corrective Bill

FOR the purpose of making certain technical corrections to provisions relating to docking masters and bay pilots; altering the date on which the term of an appointed member of the State Board of Docking Masters begins; repealing certain oath requirements; clarifying the circumstances when a docking master must be employed; providing that, for certain training trips occurring before a certain date, independent supervision and verification satisfies certain licensure requirements; ratifying and validating certain corrections made by the publisher of the Annotated Code; making this Act an emergency measure; and generally relating to docking masters and bay pilots.

SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF

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(4) agree to participate in a U.S. Coast Guard approved random drug 25 testing program;
(5) possess the following U.S. Coast Guard licenses and accreditations:
(i) a first-class pilot license for steam and motor vessels of 28 unlimited tonnage for the waters on which the applicant will operate;

28 (a) The Commission shall establish fees and charges for a licensed docking 29 master to provide docking services in the Ports of Maryland at a just and reasonable 30 rate.

31 (b) The Commission shall give notice and hold a public hearing on each rate 32 proposal as provided in this article.

33 (c) In determining a just and reasonable rate, the Commission shall consider:
