3 FOR the purpose of making certain technical corrections to provisions relating to 4 docking masters and bay pilots; altering the date on which the term of an 5 appointed member of the State Board of Docking Masters begins; repealing 6 certain oath requirements; clarifying the circumstances when a docking master 7 must be employed; providing that, for certain training trips occurring before a 8 certain date, independent supervision and verification satisfies certain 9 licensure requirements; ratifying and validating certain corrections made by the 10 publisher of the Annotated Code; making this Act an emergency measure; and 11 generally relating to docking masters and bay pilots.
