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A BILL ENTITLED

1 AN ACT concerning

2 **Higher Education - Maryland Teacher Scholarships - Service Obligation**

3 FOR the purpose of expanding the program of Maryland teacher scholarships to  
4 include all students who pledge to be certified as teachers and to work in  
5 elementary and secondary schools in the State; altering a certain definition; and  
6 generally relating to the program of Maryland teacher scholarships.

17 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF  
18 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

19 **Article - Education**

20 18-2201.

21 (a) In this subtitle the following words have the meanings indicated.

22 (b) "Eligible institution" means a public or private institution of higher  
23 education in this State that possesses a certificate of approval from the Maryland  
24 Higher Education Commission.

25 (c) (1) "Service obligation" means to teach full time in the State as a teacher  
26 in a Maryland public elementary or secondary school OR AS A CERTIFIED TEACHER IN  
27 A MARYLAND ELEMENTARY OR SECONDARY SCHOOL.

1 (2) "Service obligation" does not mean employment as teaching  
2 assistants, volunteer service, paid fellowships, or internships.

3 (d) "Administration" means the State Scholarship Administration as defined  
4 in § 18-101(b) of this title.

6 There is a program of Maryland teacher scholarships that are awarded under  
7 this subtitle for students who pledge to work IN THIS STATE ON COMPLETION OF  
8 THEIR STUDIES as public elementary and secondary school teachers OR AS CERTIFIED  
9 TEACHERS IN A MARYLAND ELEMENTARY OR SECONDARY SCHOOL [in this State  
10 upon completion of their studies].

12 (b) A recipient of the Maryland Teacher Scholarship shall:

13 (1) Be a Maryland resident;

14 (2) Except as provided in subsection (c) of this section, be accepted for  
15 admission as a full-time student or be currently enrolled at an eligible institution as  
16 a full-time student pursuing a course of study or program in an academic discipline  
17 leading to a Maryland professional teacher's certificate;

18 (3) (i) For a student currently enrolled in high school, have earned a  
19 cumulative grade point average of at least 3.0 on a 4.0 scale or its equivalent in core  
20 curriculum courses at the time of application; or

21 (ii) For a student currently enrolled as a full-time undergraduate  
22 student, have maintained a grade point average of at least 3.0 on a 4.0 scale and have  
23 been making satisfactory progress toward a degree in an academic discipline leading  
24 to a Maryland professional teacher's certificate;

25 (4) Sign a letter of intent to perform the service obligation upon  
26 completion of the recipient's required studies;

27 (5) Accept any other conditions attached to the award; and

28 (6) Satisfy any additional criteria the Commission may establish.

30 (a) Except as provided in subsection (b) of this section, the recipient of a  
31 Maryland Teacher Scholarship shall repay the Commission the funds received as set  
32 forth in § 18-112 of this title if the recipient does not:

33 (1) Satisfy the degree requirements of the eligible course of study or  
34 program or fulfill other requirements as provided in this subtitle;

1                   (2)       Perform the service obligation for 1 year for each year that the  
2 recipient has a scholarship awarded under this subtitle; and

3                   (3)       Become professionally certified to teach in the State of Maryland  
4 within the time period specified by the Commission in consultation with the  
5 Maryland Department of Education.

6       SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect  
7 June 1, 2001.
