1 SINGLE SOURCE FOR CREDENTIALS VERIFICATION OF HEALTH CARE 2 PROFESSIONALS:

3 (1) THE ADMINISTRATION OF THE SYSTEM BY A SINGLE STATE AGENCY;

10 (4) THE UTILIZATION OF A CREDENTIALS VERIFICATION PROCESS THAT

 12 HEALTH CARE ORGANIZATIONS AND THE NATIONAL COMMITTEE FOR QUALITY
 13 ASSURANCE, AND APPLICABLE PROVISIONS IN FEDERAL AND STATE LAW; AND

14(5)THE IMPOSITION OF A USER FEE FUNDING MECHANISM THAT15RESULTS IN BUDGET NEUTRALITY.

16(C)(1)AS PART OF THE STUDY, THE COMMISSION SHALL INCLUDE17FINDINGS AND RECOMMENDATIONS FOR LEGISLATION TO IMPLEMENT A SINGLE18STATE CREDENTIALS VERIFICATION SYSTEM.

(2) THE COMMISSION SHALL REPORT ITS FINDINGS AND
 RECOMMENDATIONS ON THE DEVELOPMENT OF A SINGLE STATE CREDENTIALS
 VERIFICATION SYSTEM TO THE SENATE FINANCE COMMITTEE AND THE HOUSE
 ENVIRONMENTAL MATTERS COMMITTEE ON OR BEFORE DECEMBER 1, 2001, IN
 ACCORDANCE WITH § 2 1246 OF THE STATE GOVERNMENT ARTICLE.

24 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect

25 June 1, 2001. It shall remain effective for a period of <u>1 year and</u> 7 months and, at the

26 end of December 31, $\frac{2001}{2002}$, with no further action required by the General

27 Assembly, this Act shall be abrogated and of no further force and effect.

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
