| WHEREAS, The nonnative bird species known as the mute swan is causing 6 ecological damage to areas of the Chesapeake Bay; | 15 16 |
| WHEREAS, Reports indicate that the population of mute swans in the State has grown from 5 mute swans in 1962 to about 4,000 mute swans at present; | 17 18 |
| WHEREAS, Mute swans are aggressive birds that have forced other birds, such as least terns and black skimmers out of areas, such as Hooper's Island, where these other waterfowl naturally congregate; | |

- WHEREAS, Reports indicate that a mute swan can eat between 8 and 9 pounds 2 of submerged aquatic vegetation per day;
- WHEREAS, Reports indicate that the mute swan population destroys between 9
- 4 and 11 million pounds of submerged aquatic vegetation per year; now, therefore,
- 5 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF
- 6 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:
- 7 Article Natural Resources
- 8 10-211.
- 9 (A) THE DEPARTMENT SHALL ESTABLISH A PROGRAM TO CONTROL THE 10 POPULATION OF THE NONNATIVE BIRD SPECIES KNOWN AS THE MUTE SWAN.
- 11 (B) (1) THE PROGRAM ESTABLISHED UNDER THIS SECTION SHALL INCLUDE 12 THE MANAGED HARVEST OF ADULT MUTE SWANS.
- 13 (2) THE DEPARTMENT SHALL SOLICIT LICENSED HUNTERS TO
- 14 PARTICIPATE IN THE MANAGED HARVEST OF ADULT MUTE SWANS ESTABLISHED
- 15 UNDER THIS SUBSECTION.
- 16 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect
- 17 July 1, 2001.
