- WHEREAS, It is in the vital interests of the State of Maryland to prevent the
- 24 loss of children's lives to firearms accidents; and
- 25 WHEREAS, It is necessary to teach children that a gun is not a toy and what
- 26 they should do if they happen on an accessible firearm; and
- WHEREAS, The Eddie Eagle GunSafe Program has taught gun safety to 15
- 28 million children of all grade levels free of charge through more than 20,000 school

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	systems, law enforcement agencies, and civic groups in all 50 states, Canada, and Puerto Rico; and
5 6	WHEREAS, In 1996 the Youth Activities Division of the National Safety Council, a nonprofit, nongovernmental, international public service organization dedicated to improving the safety, health, and environmental well-being of all people, awarded its Award of Merit to the Eddie Eagle GunSafe Program for its efforts to "promote safety and health, save lives, lessen injury and reduce economic loss"; and
10	WHEREAS, The American Legion in 1995 presented the Eddie Eagle GunSafe Program with its National Education Award, and in 1994 passed a resolution recognizing the importance of the Program and encouraging its posts to introduce the Program to local schools and law enforcement agencies; and
12 13	WHEREAS, In 1994 the National School Public Relations Association presented the Eddie Eagle GunSafe Program with its Golden Achievement Award; and
16 17 18 19	WHEREAS, The National Association of School Safety and Law Enforcement Officers, a nonprofit organization that is dedicated to ensuring safe learning environments and that provides national leadership in the effort to curb violence, drugs, gangs, weapons, vandalism, and other threats to school safety and security, passed a resolution endorsing "gun safety education for children that is promoted through the Eddie Eagle GunSafe Program" and found that the Program "effectively teaches youngsters what to do if they encounter a firearm"; and
	WHEREAS, Twenty-one states have passed legislation recommending or recognizing the importance of the Eddie Eagle GunSafe Program and twenty-three governors have recognized the importance of the Program; and
26 27 28 29	WHEREAS, The Office of Juvenile Justice and Delinquency Prevention under the United States Department of Justice, at the request of then Attorney General Janet Reno, prepared a report titled Promising Strategies to Reduce Gun Violence, which included the Eddie Eagle GunSafe Program as one of only 60 programs selected out of more than 400 programs reviewed, and listed the Program as an outstanding education initiative and alternative strategy for prevention of firearms accidents; now, therefore,
