A BILL ENTITLED

1 AN ACT concerning

2 Education - Financing - Mentoring Program

- 3 FOR the purpose of requiring the Maryland Department of Education to adopt certain
- 4 regulations regarding statewide procedures for teacher mentoring programs;
- 5 and specifying certain requirements for certain plans for teacher mentoring

- 12 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF
- 13 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:
- 14 Article Education
- 15 5-206.
- 16 (e) (1) For fiscal year 1999 and every fiscal year thereafter, each school with
- 17 a free or reduced price student meal count of 25 percent or more of its student
- 18 population shall receive an \$8,000 grant to enhance teacher development in dealing
- 19 with at-risk students.
- 20 (2) Beginning in fiscal year 1999, the Governor shall include in each
- 21 year's operating budget not less than the amount appropriated in fiscal year 1998 for
- 22 the Baltimore County Teacher Mentoring Program. In addition to that amount, the
- 23 Baltimore County Teacher Mentoring Program shall receive \$5,000,000 annually to
- 24 enhance its teacher mentoring program as a pilot to determine best practices for
- 25 mentoring teachers working with at-risk students and addressing teacher retention
- 26 in schools with high at-risk student populations.
- 27 (3) For fiscal year 1999 and every fiscal year thereafter, the Governor
- 28 shall include in each year's operating budget \$2 million to fund a teacher mentoring

- **HOUSE BILL 799** 1 program in Prince George's County which shall be modeled after the Baltimore 2 County Teacher Mentoring Program. (4) THE DEPARTMENT SHALL ADOPT REGULATIONS ESTABLISHING 4 STATEWIDE PROCEDURES FOR TEACHER MENTORING PROGRAMS. To the extent funds are provided in the State budget or are available 6 from other sources for this purpose, the Department and each public school system 7 shall expand existing professional development programs for school-based 8 administrators and principals and develop new programs to assist these individuals 9 in dealing with at-risk students. 10 5-206.1. 11 It is the intent of this section to provide competitive grants to encourage 12 county boards to expand and develop mentoring programs. 13 Subject to the appropriation of funds in the annual State budget, the State 14 Superintendent annually shall distribute in accordance with the criteria specified in 15 subsection (c) of this section competitive grants to county boards for expansion of 16 mentor programs. 17 A county board applying for a grant under this section shall submit a (c) (1) plan for funding to the State Superintendent AND THE PLAN SHALL INCLUDE THE 19 REQUIREMENT THAT, BEGINNING IN SEPTEMBER, THE MENTOR AND THE TEACHER 20 SHALL MEET AT LEAST ONCE A MONTH DURING THE SCHOOL YEAR. 21 (2) The State Superintendent shall give priority to plans targeting funds 22 to schools in which 40% of the students receive free or reduced price meals. 23 In addition to the criteria in paragraph (2) of this subsection, the 24 State Superintendent shall give priority to plans targeting funds to schools in which: 25 50% or more of the teachers have 5 years or less of teaching (i) 26 experience; or
- 27 (ii) Student achievement scores on local, State, and national

28 assessments are at or below a satisfactory level.

- 29 (d) The total grants distributed under this section for any fiscal year may not 30 exceed \$5,000,000.
- 31 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take 32 effect October 1, 2001.
